Solent University offers the following scholarships

(Please always check the eligibility criteria for each scholarship before applying, to avoid disappointment).

SPORTS SCHOLARSHIPS

These scholarships are awarded to athletes competing at national and international levels in a variety of sports.

- We offer scholarships from £1,000 up to a maximum of £5,000
- Focus sport services packages
- Individual bespoke athlete services packages

Applicants must be full-time or part-time undergraduate or postgraduate students. For full details and eligibility criteria please go to this link

BLACK, ASIAN, AND MINORITY ETHNIC (BAME) SCHOLARSHIP

These scholarships provide eligible **first year** undergraduate students, from specific ethnic backgrounds, £1,000 each to use towards their university tuition fees or accommodation. For full details and eligibility criteria please go to this <u>link</u>

SOLENT SANCTUARY SCHOLARSHIP

In support of our vision and values, each year Solent University awards one Solent Sanctuary Scholarship consisting of a full yearly fee waiver and a £3,000 grant to a person seeking sanctuary studying on a three-year undergraduate programme. UNDERGRADUATE ACADEMIC MERIT SCHOLARSHIP (UAMS)

The University offers an Undergraduate Academic Merit Scholarship to reward applicants who have demonstrated outstanding academic ability.

These are awarded automatically (no application necessary) based on final results. For full details and eligibility criteria please go here

POSTGRADUATE TAUGHT ACADEMIC MERIT SCHOLARSHIPS (PAMS)

The University offers, as a tuition fee reduction, a limited amount of postgraduate academic scholarships. These are open to all students who are self-financing (not sponsored by their government or employer). However, if you are a Solent graduate eligible for an alumni discount you would **not** be eligible for a PAMS scholarship too. DIRECT ENTRY ACADEMIC MERIT SCHOLARSHIP (DAMS)

The University offers a Direct Entry (Year 3 and Top-up) Academic Merit Scholarship as a way to reward students who have demonstrated outstanding academic ability. These are awarded automatically (no application necessary) based on final results. Scholarships will be awarded as a tuition fee credit between £500 and £1,000. GREAT SCHOLARSHIPS FOR JUSTICE AND LAW

The GREAT Scholarships for justice and law is a new time-limited programme from the Study UK campaign and the Ministry of Justice. The GREAT Scholarships for justice and law are jointly funded by Solent University, with the UK government's GREAT Britain campaign and the British Council. This year, in partnership with the British Council and the GREAT Britain Campaign, Solent University is offering one scholarship of £10,000 to students from Kenya. This scholarship scheme is part of the GREAT Scholarships 2023 campaign, which has been launched by the British Council together with UK universities to support more students to access excellent UK higher education opportunities. The GREAT Scholarships scheme offers an exciting opportunity for students from Kenya to get financial support to pursue postgraduate study in the UK. SCHOLARSHIPS FOR MSC APPLIED AI AND DATA SCIENCE

Solent University has secured 36 scholarships (£10,000 each) as part of the £13million Office for Students (OfS) funding initiative. These scholarships are to assist applicants from under-represented groups in AI and data science areas and are available for full and part-time routes of this course.

Before applying for a scholarship, you must have applied for the course and provided all the required documents, including reference letters.

SUPPORT GRANT

This means tested grant is for students who are experiencing financial difficulty and who have exhausted all other sources of funding. It can be used to help towards rent, food, utility bills, course costs etc.

'Home' UK and eligible EU*, full-time and part-time undergraduate (U/G) and postgraduate (P/G) students can apply. All applicants must be in receipt of their FULL funding entitlement of tuition fee loan and maintenance loan or postgraduate loan. Applications open Monday 16 October 2023 to Friday 21 June 2024. *EU students with settled status and in receipt of their full UK student funding (Maintenance Loan (ML) or Postgraduate loan (PGL)).

SUMMER GRANT

This fund *may* be available during the summer vacation (July & August) for continuing students who cannot work e.g., lone parents, disabled students, or those re-sitting exams. The eligibility criteria are the same as for the Support Grant. Dates will be published in 2024. For full details, application form and eligibility criteria please go to this <u>link</u>

UNDERGRADUATE QAHE FINANCIAL SUPPORT GRANT

A non-repayable means-tested grant is available to students who require extra financial support to help meet costs which are not already being met from other statutory courses of funding or who have an unexpected financial crisis.

To be eligible, students must have **home** fee status, enrolled on a full-time undergraduate course and receive the maximum maintenance loan that they are eligible for. **Students must have received the first loan instalment before applying. PLEASE NOTE: EU STUDENTS WITH PRE-**

SETTLEMENT/INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS ARE NOT ELIGIBLE TO APPLY

COURSE COSTS GRANT

This is a means-tested grant to help support students who have **compulsory** course costs and/or final major project costs (not general costs such as books, stationary etc). The eligibility criteria are the same as for the Support Grant. Applications open Monday 2 October 2023 to Friday 21 June 2024. UNPAID PLACEMENT GRANT

This grant is available to support students who have been offered a **short-term unpaid placement** which lasts a minimum of 10 working days (or 100 hours) and a maximum of 20. If over 20 days, students can still apply but we will only assess up to 20 working days' worth of costs. It is not for whole year placements, social work, or nursing placements.

Only full time 'home' UK and EU (U/G and P/G) are eligible to apply. You can only apply <u>once</u> during your course for this grant. Applications open from Monday 16 October 2023 to Friday 12 July 2024* For full details, application form and eligibility criteria please go to this <u>link</u>

* If you arrange your placement **after** the closing date but it's before 31 August 2024, please contact <u>student.funding@solent.ac.uk</u> for advice.

ACCESSIBLE NEEDS SUPPORT GRANT

This grant is a contribution to support students requiring a diagnostic assessment in order to receive support from the university and the 'disabled students' allowance'. The eligibility criteria are the same as for the Support Grant. Students can also apply for financial support with the Blue Badge student parking permit. Applications open from 2 October 2023 until 21 June 2024. For full details, application

INTERNATIONAL MARKETING PLACEMENT GRANT

This grant is available to support students who have been offered to take part in the International Marketing Week programme. The grant can help towards placement costs and travel. Once students apply for their placements, they will be given details how to apply for funding support. Full time 'Home' UK and EU (U/G and P/G) are eligible to apply.

CARE LEAVERS, FOYER FEDERATION AND SUPPORTED ACCOMMODATION BURSARIES

Care leavers are recognised as a priority group as part of the university's admissions procedure for contextual offers. Our support package includes a **£1,500** bursary each academic year along with other support.

We also provide additional support to students who have lived in **Foyer Federation/supported accommodation**. This includes an annual bursary of **£1,500** each academic year. If successful, you will receive the bursary in instalments over the academic year, providing you remain on, and demonstrate an acceptable level of engagement, with your course. The deadline to submit applications is 21 June 2024.

CARERS' BURSARY

This non-repayable bursary of £1,200 per year is awarded to carers who continue to have significant caring responsibilities whilst studying at university. Students must have been recognised as a carer by their local authority. It is paid in instalments over the academic year directly into the student's bank account. The deadline to submit applications is 21 June 2024. For full details, application form and eligibility criteria please go to this link

Carers must be aware that they are **not eligible** to receive the **DWP carers allowance** whilst in full time education.

ESTRANGED STUDENTS' BURSARY

This is a non-repayable bursary of £1,500 per year awarded to students who have been assessed as an estranged student by student finance and continue to be estranged from their parents whilst they are studying at university. You must be a Home UK or EU national with settled status, full-time undergraduate student who has taken out their maximum entitlement of maintenance loan for the academic year. The deadline to submit applications is 21 June 2024.

GYPSY, ROMA, TRAVELLER, SHOWMAN, BOATER COMMUNITY BURSARY

Solent University is committed to the <u>GTRSB into Higher Education Pledge</u> The University recognises the unique individual experiences of Gypsy, Traveller, Roma, Showman and Boater students and how these may inhibit access and participation in Higher Education. The University has introduced this bursary to provide additional financial **and pastoral support** to GTRSB students.

If you're from the Gypsy, Traveller and Roma community, we will offer you a bursary of £500 in each year of study.

To be eligible students must:

- disclose your ethnicity of GTRSB on your UCAS application form or to the University
 upon enrolment
- · You must be enrolled on a full-time undergraduate degree
- Be a home UK student or have settled status paying £9,250 fees
- have a household income less than £25,000 and receive the maximum maintenance loan

You can apply from 2 October 2023 to 21 June 2024

PARENTS BURSARY

This bursary is for students with children who are in receipt of their maximum maintenance loan and Student Finance Parents' Learning Allowance (PLA) / or child benefit and postgraduate loan (if postgraduate). Successful applicants will be awarded a one-off payment of £300 for the academic year. You can apply from 2 October 2023 to 21 June 2024. LOCAL STUDENT BURSARY SCHEME

The Local Student Bursary Scheme is entirely funded by alumni, former Solent students, staff and friends of Solent University. Through their kind donations we are able to support local students. It opens for 1 month each year from October to November. To be considered for a bursary you must be a UK student enrolled on a full-time undergraduate degree at Solent University along with other criteria. TECHNOLOGY BURSARY

This bursary is to help towards the costs of IT equipment needed to enable students to study online.

This is a one-off payment of £400 given as a voucher. It is for new foundation and first-year students only. Please refer to the information on the university website for full eligibility criteria with this link

UTILITIES BURSARY

A non-repayable bursary of £125 is available to students who are living in the private rented sector and paying utility bills (gas and electricity). To be eligible students must be Home fee status, enrolled on a full time UG course, have received the maximum maintenance loan, indicating a parental/spousal income of under £25,000 living in the private rented sector and have evidence of paying utility bills. Private Halls of Residence and University Halls of Residence are excluded.

UNDERGRATUATE APRENTICESHIP BURSARY

A non-repayable bursary of £200 is available to students who are on apprenticeship courses to assist with the costs of attending university. To be eligible students must have **home** fee status, be enrolled as an apprentice, and have a household income under £25000 per annum.
