
What do you want to do?

FOR FINDING GRADUATE JOBS

1. Solent Futures Online (SFO)

Solent's online employability resource. It includes opportunities uploaded by employers looking specifically for Solent students and sources graduate level jobs from Indeed.

 Use SFO to access:CV360, Interview360, a CV builder, an e-learning hub, employability articles and more.

2. Prospects (www.prospects.ac.uk)

- Search for high quality and graduate specific jobs using the search engine.
- Explore the 'What can I do with my degree?' section to discover job options for your degree and browse vacancies that are live right now.
- Applying speculatively? The 'Job Profiles' section can tell you more about different roles and help you to tailor your CV.

3. LinkedIn

- LinkedIn has a dedicated job search function where you can filter by location, job type, company, industry and experience level. Be cautious when using 'Easy Apply' – ensure that your profile is up to date and contains in-depth information on your skills and experiences.
- Network! Use LinkedIn to speculatively contact employers that you would like to work for, even if they are not actively advertising a vacancy. You can send them a connection request, alongside a message asking to discuss relevant opportunities.

- Not all search engines will review adverts that are uploaded, so be sure to research the company well and ensure it's a legitimate opportunity.

SOLENT FUTURES' TOP TIPS

Keep an eye on recruitment deadlines

Websites such as www.savethestudent.org will list all the big graduate schemes along with their deadlines. Many schemes open early and have application deadlines as early as October. Make sure you're prepared and aware of all important dates.

Many jobs are never publicly advertised

Research suggests that at least 70% of jobs are not advertised online. Use your contacts to find hidden opportunities or send speculative applications. Research companies that you're interested in working for and, once you have some companies in mind, apply speculatively with a CV and covering letter.

Target your application

Your CV should be tailored to the company and prospective role. Tailor your CV using the information on the employer's website, and pull out skills and attributes from job descriptions, as well as relevant job profiles on Prospects.
